

Student Government

In order to encourage student participation in the various activities of school life and to provide opportunity for training in democratic processes, schools throughout the District may maintain and operate student councils. The Board sanctions and recommends the organization of student government bodies in the secondary schools.

Such councils shall assist in improving the general welfare of all students and shall give students the opportunity to participate in the orderly workings of the democratic process.

Members to student councils shall be elected democratically. The rights and responsibilities of the council shall be clearly set forth. An adviser for each student council shall be chosen by the principal.

Such councils shall have not have the authority to make policies for the District or regulations for the schools. However, a council may make recommendations to the administration on any topic of student concern.
